Meat Goat & Sheep Show

Goats First, Sheep to Follow

Participants are required to purchase exhibitor tickets. Entry Fee \$1.00 Per Head.
Exhibitors must provide bedding for livestock.

Entry fees due by check in. Cash or Check Only.

Exhibitors are allowed to enter no more than two animals in any one lot.

All animals are to be in place by 10:00am. on the day of the show. Facilities will be available by 8:00 a.m. No bedding will be furnished by the Fair. All market entries must be weighed by 12:00 p.m. The show will begin at 1:00 p.m. Animals will be released at 7:00 p.m. Participants are required to purchase exhibitor tickets for themselves and for any person assisting them at the show. Entry Fee \$1.00 per head.

In addition to the health requirements by the State of Tennessee, the following health requirements will apply to the Goat and Sheep shows. All animals are subject to being inspected after arrival at the show facilities and any with clinical signs of contagious disease will be sent home immediately. Certificate(s) of Veterinary Inspection are to accompany the animal(s) to the respective shows. Veterinarians will examine for signs of infectious diseases (i.e. sourmouth, pinkeye, ringworm, abscesses, suspected caseous lymphadenitis. With reference to caseous lymphadenitis: enlargements of the lymph nodes, whether draining or not, will not be admitted.) The veterinarian has the final decision on whether animals satisfy all health requirements. By application for admission, each exhibitor agrees to show his/her animals subject to these rules. Presenting Obviously Unhealthy animals, as defined above, may result in the entire herd's disqualification from the show, subject to the ruling of the Show Committee.

PRE-REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED.
ALL ANIMALS MUST HAVE A SCRAPIE TAG

Breeding Sheep Show

All animals entered in the show must be purebred and must be registered in the name of the exhibitor, or transferred to the exhibitor by July 22nd. Registration certificate of transfer certificate, properly executed, must be presented to the chairperson of the show when sheep arrive at the fairgrounds. Lease contracts will be accepted at the time of entry, provided they are legally entered into on or before July 1 prior to show. Leased animals will not be eligible to show in the Senior Showmanship events.

Same lot substitutions will be accepted at time of check-in.

Exhibitors are allowed no more than two entries in any one lot.

Exception to age classification listed under the lot number may be made when an exhibitor wished to enter a younger animal in an older age classification. In no case may an older animal be entered in a younger classification than its birthdate would permit.

A minimum of six animals owned by two different people is required to make a breed show.

** An exhibitor may enter a total of two yearling ewes. They may be in the same class or different classes.

Market/Commercial Ewe Show

Lambs must be owned by exhibitor prior to July 22. An exhibitor may show no more than six lambs in the Market Lamb Show. All market lambs must have lamb teeth and must be wether or ewe lambs. Ewe lambs shown as market lambs cannot show in Junior Breeding Show. Lambs must weigh a minimum of 75 pounds. There is no maximum weight. Lambs will be weighed and divided into lots by weight.

Goat Show

Class 13 - Goats - Breeding Meat Goat Show

Animals must be registered in a Meat Goat Association.

Open to registered percentage or fullblood.

Animals shown in this class cannot be shown in Market Goat Show.

Class 14 - Goats - Market Goat Show

Any breed or cross breed of goat can show (registration not required).

All goats will be weighed and classified prior to the show and will be divided into classes by weight.

All animals must have either an ear tag or legible tattoo to be able to show.

All animals will be doe kids or wether kids (must not exhibit any testicular tissue).

An animal must show no breaking of skin or eruption of either of two permanent front teeth.

Milk teeth must be in place.

All animals must be slick shorn with 3/8" of hair or less.

An exhibitor can show a maximum of two animals in this Class.

All premium money available will be used, and individual prize money will depend on the number of animals shown. Animals will not be grouped but all will be considered in one group for the purpose of allocating the premiums. All animals deemed worthy by the Judge will receive a blue participating ribbon. Group money paid will not exceed \$9. The three highest placings in each class will receive the following additional premiums: 1st - \$3; 2nd - \$2; 3rd - \$1. \$1 pen fee will be charged.
